The Liturgical Verbiage reads, " Let us offer a sign of peace". and the rubric reads - *offer a sign of peace according to the local custom*. Thus, a polite nod of the head will suffice, as long as within your heart, you can say you hold no ill will towards the other - this direction would be satisfied.
